2011 (completed 8-15-11) :

1 Deficiency (Level D)

Level D means the deficiency found was NOT a pattern or widespread, instead it was considered an ISOLATED incident.

Level D also means NO actual harm was caused to any patient.

A patient's clip alarm was found not to be clipped to her while she was sitting in her recliner. When this was discovered, staff re-attached the clip alarm. After further evaluation, it was felt the patient may have removed the clip alarm herself so it was changed to a pressure sensor alarm. There was no incident or injury caused to the patient. Corrective action and re-education was immediately completed with staff.

2010 (completed 7-21-10) :

2009 (completed 5-12-09) :

1 Deficiency (Level D)

Level D means the deficiency found was NOT a pattern or widespread, instead it was considered an ISOLATED incident.

Level D also means NO actual harm was caused to any patient.

A nursing assistant left a patient sitting alone in a shower room for a quick moment while she grabbed an extra towel from the linen room right next to the shower room. There was no incident or injury caused to the patient. Corrective action and re-education was immediately completed with staff.
